## **Empowering Undocumented Immigrant Youth & Allies Since 2010**

The UCLA Dream Resource Center (DRC) beliefs everyone deserves the right to learn, be healthy, and pursue their dreams, regardless of their immigration status. After the U.S. Senate failed to pass the federal DREAM Act in 2010, the UCLA Dream Resource Center was formally founded at the UCLA Labor Center to support undocumented immigrant youth.

Since 2010, the UCLA Dream Resource Center has served as a safe and empowering space for undocumented immigrant youth and allies to organize and advocate for immigrant rights, workers' rights, and social justice.

## **Major Projects**

### **Dream Summer Fellowship**

Dream Summer is an annual, 8-week, national fellowship that empowers undocumented immigrant youth and allies to be the next generation of social justice leaders through leadership and professional development, intersectional movement building, and on-the-ground experience in community-based and social justice organizations.

## Labor Summer Fellowship

Labor Summer is an annual fellowship that brings together UCLA students and community organizations who share a vision for worker justice and labor rights. Student participants are matched with a host organization for an 8-week, full-time fellowship to complete projects that strengthen the intersection between the organization's social justice mission and labor issues.

#### DRC Alumni Network

Sustaining social change requires people power! Graduates of the DRC's fellowships join a growing network of close to 900 alumni across the nation. The DRC Alumni Network connects and channels the collective power of alumni; creates opportunities for alumni to build community; and provides personal, professional, and leadership development opportunities for alumni.




