OUR MISSION

The UCLA Labor Center's Young Worker Initiative strengthens the labor movement's school-to-movement pathway by providing classroom curricula and know-your-rights trainings to middle and high school students in California, as well as educational workshops to community members. The UCLA Labor Center prioritizes young workers through research, internships, and programming that support policy initiatives. Created by young workers, for young workers, the initiative recognizes young people as a critical workforce in the economy and elevates them as leaders in their workplace.

Classroom Curricula

We develop dynamic, interactive "know-your-rights" trainings designed to empower young workers and community members with essential knowledge of workplace rights. Through partnerships with LAUSD schools, our wide-ranging curricula provide hands-on learning that equips middle and high school students with the tools to advocate for fair treatment in the workplace.



Community Partnerships

We collaborate with community organizations like YouthSource and the Young Worker Education Project to reach young workers where they are. These partnerships allow us to bring immersive labor education directly to LAUSD students, ensuring that young people have access to critical resources and support as they enter the workforce.

We center student involvement in all aspects of our work, from research and curriculum development to workshop facilitation. Through the initiative, young workers themselves play a key role in shaping the labor movement by participating in applied research, developing innovative educational tools, and leading know-your-rights trainings for their peers.
